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'Severe mental impairment' qualifying benefits

- a) Attendance Allowance¹
- b) The Daily Living component of Personal Independence Payment²
- c) Disability Living Allowance Care component, but only if paid at the middle or high rate³
- d) Universal Credit:
 - o In Scotland any award of Universal Credit is a qualifying benefit.4
 - o In England and Wales⁵ the Universal Credit award must include the payment of the 'limited capability for work' or limited capability for work related activity' components. If one of these elements should be in payment but you have been sanctioned you can still qualify.
- e) In Scotland, only Employment and Support Allowance.⁶

Note on Employment and Support Allowance (ESA): When ESA was introduced the government said that it would be included as a qualifying benefit for the severe mental impairment rules. But the law in England and Wales was never changed. Some local authorities in England and Wales do count it as a qualifying benefit despite this.

- f) Severe Disablement Allowance⁷
- g) Constant Attendance Allowance, which is a type of Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit⁸

- h) Unemployability Supplement, which is a type of Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit that can be included in claims made before 19879
- i) A war pension under the 1983 scheme that includes Constant Attendance Allowance¹⁰
- j) A war pension under the 1983 scheme that includes Unemployability Allowance¹¹
- k) Income Support, where the person has been deemed to be incapable of work and so the payment includes the disability premium¹²
- I) Incapacity Benefit 13
- m) Armed Forces Independence Payment¹⁴
- n) Where you are a member of a couple claiming income-based Jobseeker's Allowance and you have been deemed to be incapable of work and so the payment includes the disability premium¹⁵
- o) Short-Term Incapacity Benefit (a lower rate of Incapacity Benefit that used to be paid at the start of the claim before the benefit was abolished for new claimants)16
- p) Disability Working Allowance in England and Wales (an old benefit abolished in 1999) or Disabled Persons Tax Credit in Scotland (abolished in 2003)¹⁷

Note on Disability Working Allowance and Disabled Persons' Tax Credit. These benefits were replaced by the disability element of Working Tax Credit. Although the rules were never updated, some local authorities will accept the disability element of Working Tax Credit as a qualifying benefit.
