

Hospital pharmacy time critical Parkinson's medication guide

Person with Parkinson's admitted to hospital/emergency department

- Ensure patients are prioritised for accurate medicines reconciliation
- Check medications have been prescribed correctly including correct timings
- Avoid medications that worsen Parkinson's



People with Parkinson's receive their medication on

Please note: zero tolerance for medicines administered

more than 30 mins after the prescribed time.

Ensure correct timings are clearly displayed on

medication labels, discharge and transfer letters etc.

Are the correct medications available on the ward / via the patient's supply? Please note: zero tolerance for "drugs unavailable".

- Ensure all staff are aware of the steps to follow when Parkinson's medication is required urgently (including during out of hours).
- Ensure pharmacy stocks have appropriate levels of Parkinson's medication.
- Ensure emergency cupboards/ specific wards stock full supply of all Parkinson's medicines.
- Consider using the patient's own medication (including compliance aids) as per local guidance.
