This Volunteering Agreement sets out how, together, as volunteers and staff, we can make this happen, and the support you can expect from the charity in your volunteer role.

#### Together we will:

- Ensure a shared understanding of Parkinson's UK and of your role in the charity, including the importance of completing the right level of induction and training for every role
- Be open; creating opportunities for you to feed in ideas and suggestions about the organisation and your role
- Stay in touch; you'll have regular contact with appropriate staff and other volunteers, and we'll keep you informed about the wider work of Parkinson's UK
- Feel comfortable raising concerns, which will be listened to and responded to so that you feel safe, supported and comfortable
- Collaborate on matters relating to volunteering, and ensure that volunteering is recognised, valued and celebrate
- Ensure everyone with a connection to Parkinson's sees us as a trusted, well run and inclusive charity

- Communicate with everyone volunteers, staff and the public openly, honestly and respectfully, whether in person, by phone, writing or digital media
- Operate in line with policies and procedures relevant to your role, including data protection and confidentiality, problem solving, safeguarding (England) or safeguarding (NI, Scotland and Wales) and health and safety
- Meet mutually agreed expectations about your volunteer roles, following reasonable requests by Parkinson's UK staff and other volunteers, whilst supporting you to get the most from it
- Ensure volunteering is inclusive, and in line with Parkinson's UK's Equality, Diversity and Inclusion policy
- Ensure you have the relevant support and information you need to carry out your role, with a named staff contact, helping you build on the strengths you bring to the charity
- Make volunteering enjoyable; putting your needs first, including if you should need to step away from volunteering at any point
- Support you to be positive, informed and enthusiastic about the charity recognising all staff and volunteers are ambassadors for Parkinson's UK

In addition, Parkinson's UK will provide:

- Safe volunteering conditions, covered by insurance
- Reimbursement for out of pocket expenses on time
- A full induction or briefing with the training you need for your role

In the case of trustees and committee members, any aspect of the Volunteering Agreement that comes into conflict with your responsibilities and obligations in carrying out your role, will not be applicable.
