Thank you for considering participating in this research project. The purpose of this

document is to explain to you what the study is about and what your participation would

involve, so as to enable you to make an informed choice.

What is the purpose of this study?

The purpose of this study is to track Parkinson's Disease (PD) symptoms across the

menstrual cycle and medication intake. You have been invited to take part as a woman

who may or may not be still menstruating. Should you choose to participate, you will

be asked to track your PD symptoms, and your period if you are still menstruating,

over 4 months using a digital app called My Moves Matter. You will also be asked to

complete an online survey, which will include questions on your demographics, PD

symptoms, medication and menstruation symptoms, if any. The survey will take about

20 minutes to complete. At the end of the study, you will be asked to complete an

online survey similar to that one that you completed at the beginning of the study.

Finally, you will be asked to complete another survey to assess your experience of

using a digital app to track your symptoms and period.

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Why have I been chosen?

You have been asked to take part in this research project as you have a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease. You have been invited to take part as a woman who may or may

not still be menstruating.

How many people will take part in this study?

We hope to recruit 200 people to take part in this study.

Do I have to take part?

Your participation in this study is completely voluntary.

• If you decide to take part, you will be asked to complete a consent form (at the

end of this information leaflet online).

• If you decide to take part, you are free to withdraw at any time without giving a

reason and without any disadvantage to your future medical treatment.

• If you decide not to take part, this will not put you at any disadvantage

regarding your current treatment.

What will happen if I agree to take part?

• If you agree to take part, you will be asked to take an online survey that you can

access through a link to a secure website. You will also be asked to share some of

your anonymous data in the My Moves Matter App.

• The surveys will not take more than 20 minutes. You can take breaks while

completing the survey, if you need to.

Questions will be asked regarding your health, medications, PD symptoms, your

quality of sleep, your mood and your daily activities and menstrual symptoms, if

you have these. You don't need to answer any questions that you feel

uncomfortable with.

All information collected will be anonymous.

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What are the possible benefits of taking part?

You may not receive any benefit from taking part in this study. The information we gather from you and the other participants will help us to understand more about the

menstrual symptoms in People with Parkinson's Disease.

What are the possible risks of taking part?

We do not believe that there are any risks of taking part in this study. Participation is voluntary, and it will not affect any future treatment that you might receive for your

condition. You may withdraw from the study at any time.

If any concerns are raised for you as a result of taking the survey, please contact your

own GP or Neurologist or local Parkinson's association.

that are collected during the study are subject to the same regulations as the data

collected for your health care.

The results of this study may be published in a medical journal, but it will not be

possible to identify you from the publication. We will store the anonymous results of

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the surveys securely for 15 years. Thereafter, they may be stored for a longer time if required by law, or they will be destroyed in line with confidential waste destruction guidelines. Results of the study will be provided to the Clinical Research and Ethics Committee of the Cork Teaching Hospitals (CREC) in compliance with national and international regulations on clinical studies.

Who will access my data?

Your anonymous data will only be accessible to study researchers, quality representatives from the study Sponsor (Monitors and Auditors), and the Clinical Research Ethics Committee of the Cork Teaching Hospitals (CREC) so that they can check if the study is being conducted to the best standards. Results of the study will be provided to the ethics committee approving the study in compliance with national and international regulations on clinical studies. The anonymous data will be stored on a University College Cork supported cloud storage platform Microsoft Forms, Qualtrics or RedCap. We are also asking for your consent to store the anonymised data in a repository, to allow it to be used to inform subsequent research studies. The information that you provide may contribute to research publications and/or conference presentations and also to newsletters.
